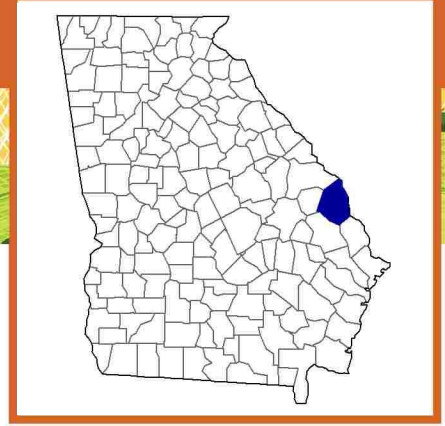


Screven County, Georgia Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

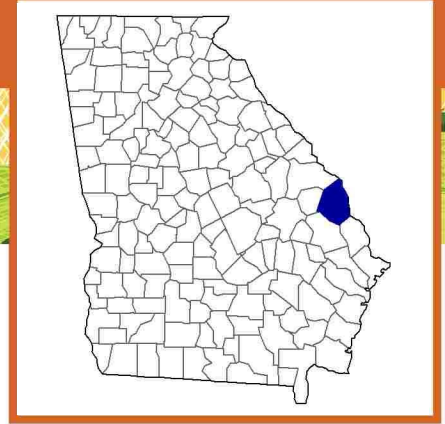

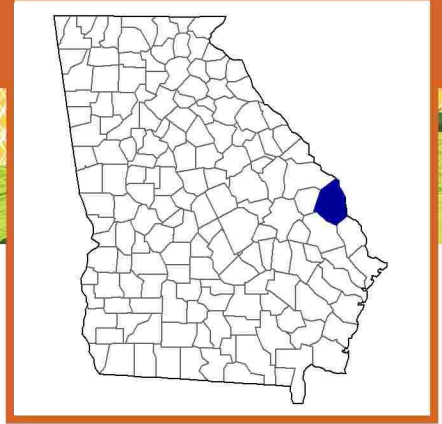

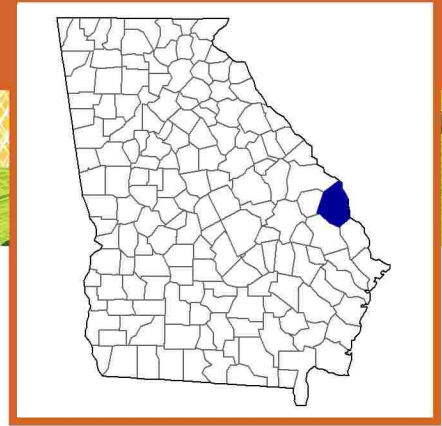
