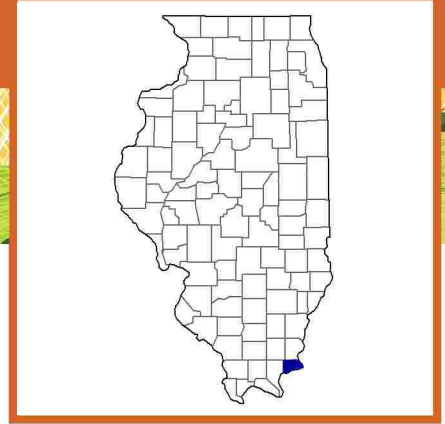


Hardin County, Illinois Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

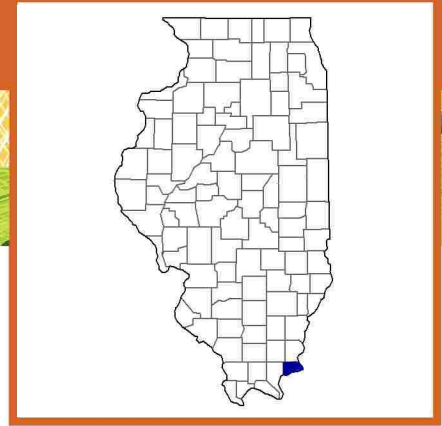
