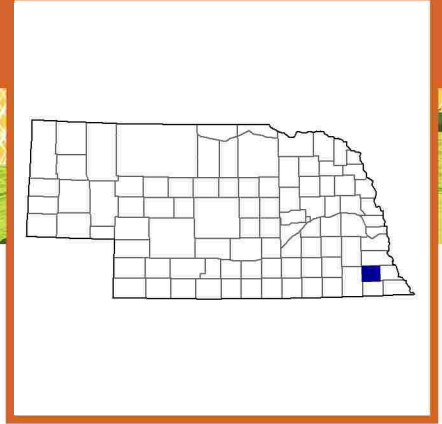


Johnson County, Nebraska Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

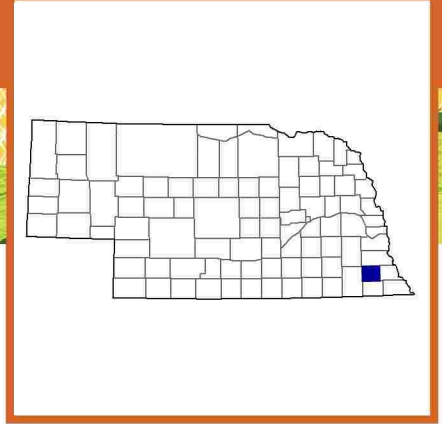

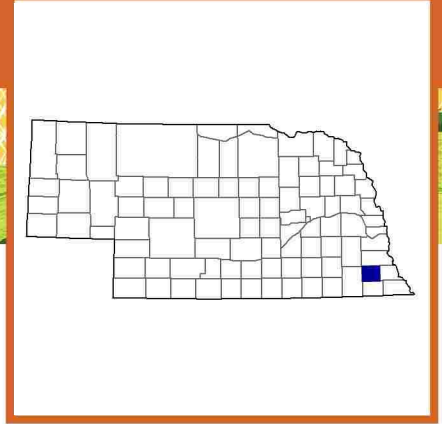

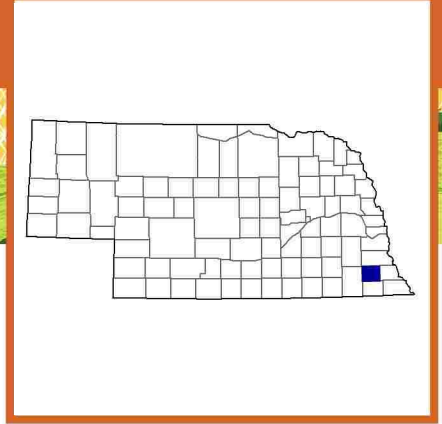

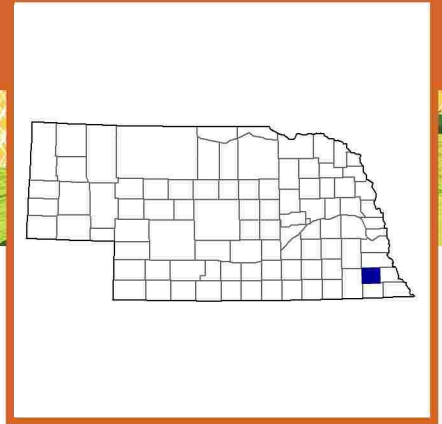

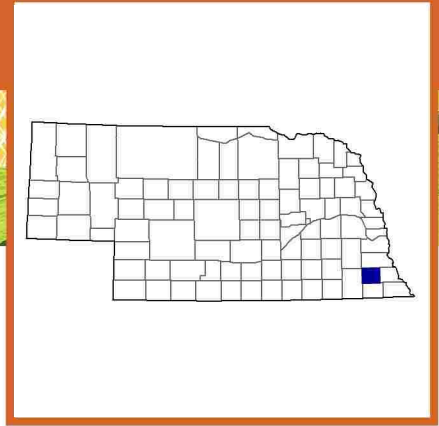
