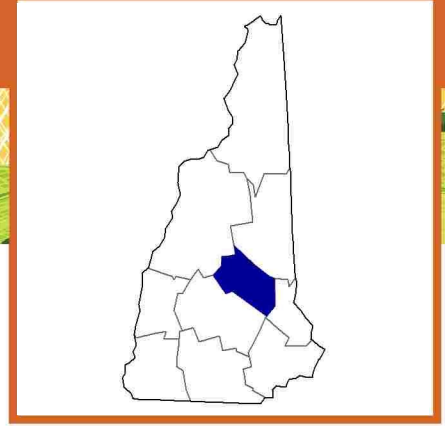


Belknap County, New Hampshire Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

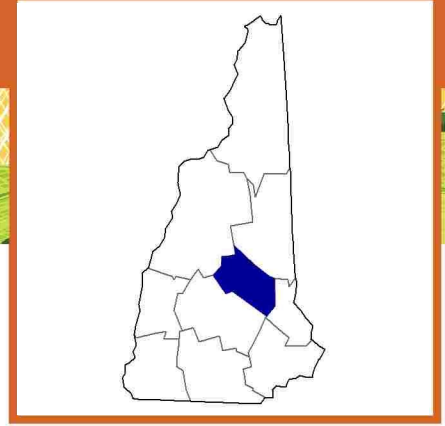

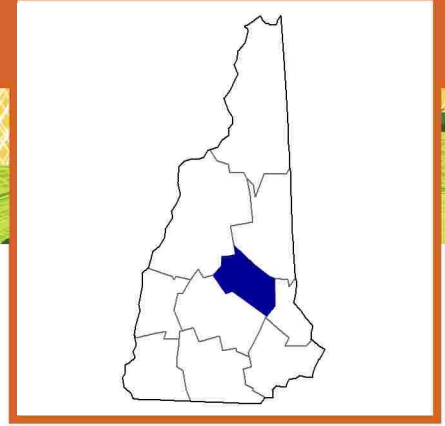

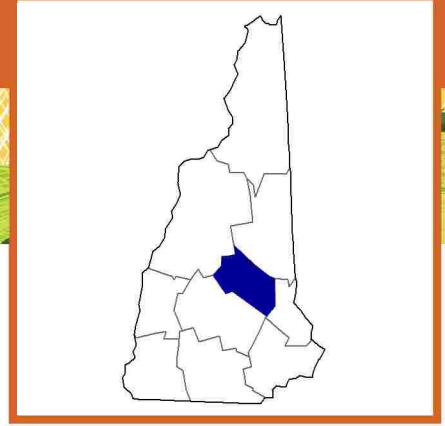

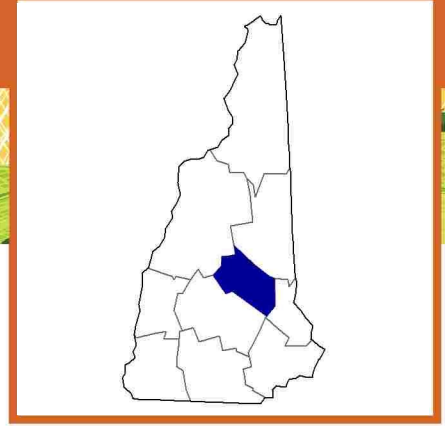

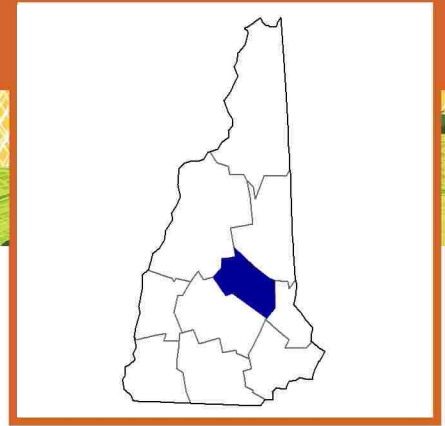
