

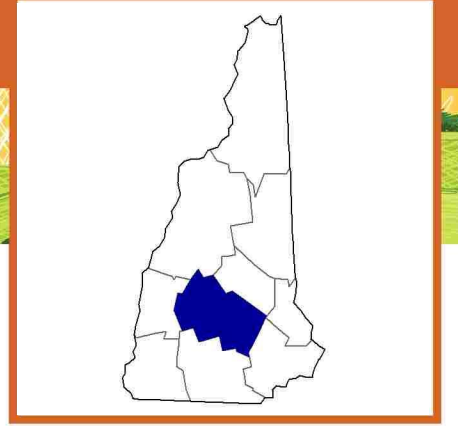

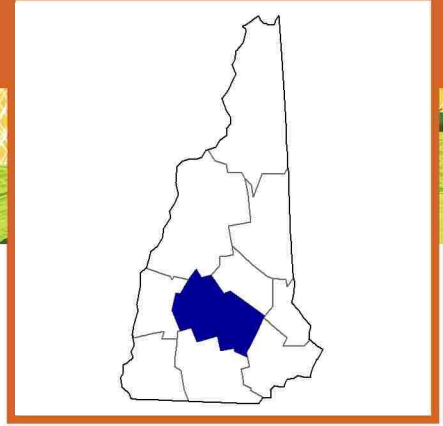


Merrimack County, New Hampshire Farms with Asian Producers^a

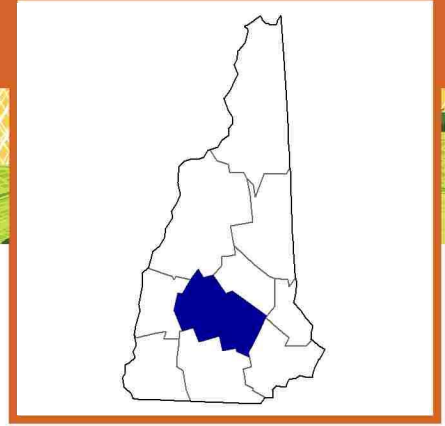

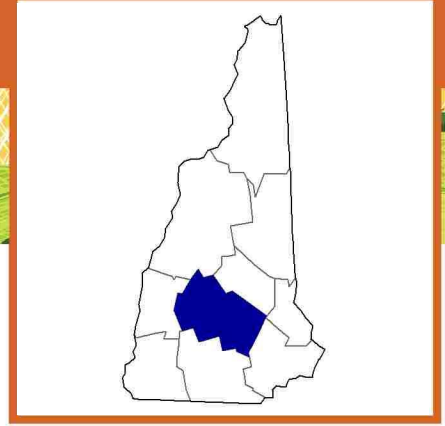

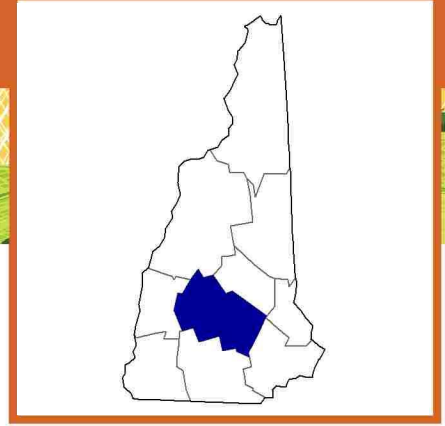

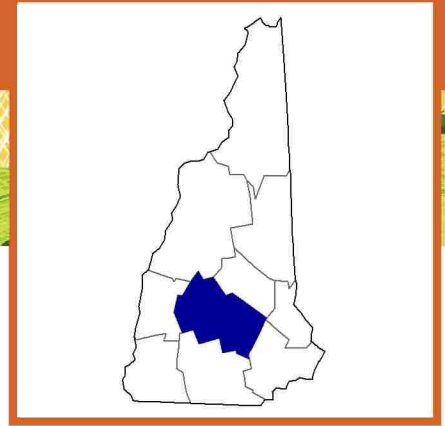
