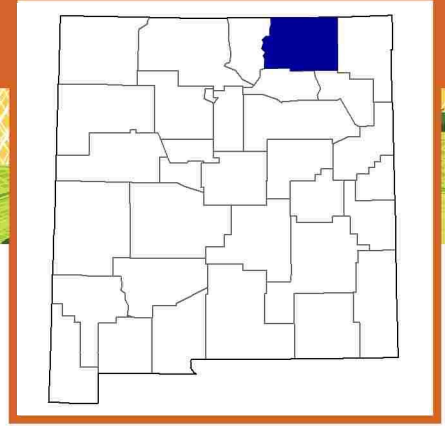


Colfax County, New Mexico Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

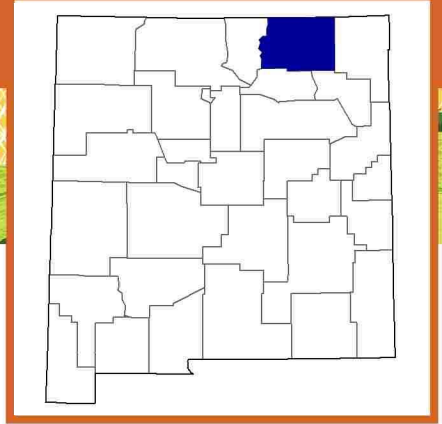

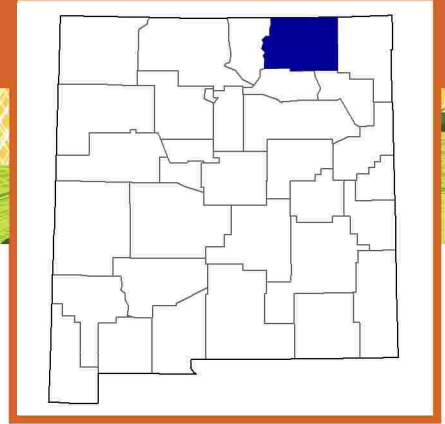

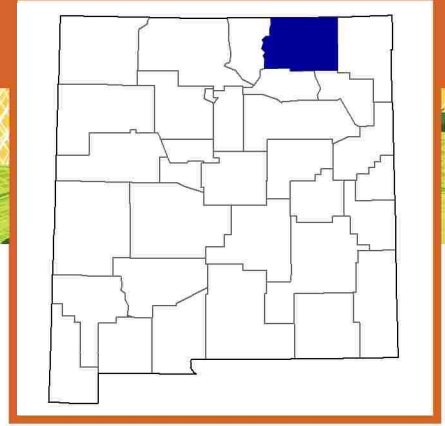

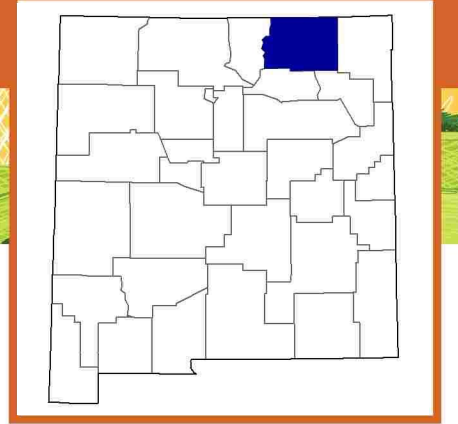
