#### General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Alabama, there were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, August 11, 2024. Precipitation ranged from no rain to 5.75 inches of rain. Average high temperatures ranged from the high 80s to the high 90s. Average low temperatures ranged from the mid 60s to the low 80s.

#### Crops

Many parts of the state did not receive any rainfall throughout the week leaving many to comment that rain was badly needed. Producers used the dryer weather to work in the fields, with multiple reports of ongoing hay harvesting and field crops spraying. Some producers reported row crops showing signs of wilt. Corn maturing and harvest continued. Cotton squaring was nearly complete, and bolls continued to open slightly ahead of the five-year average. Peanuts were in mostly good condition and nearly done pegging. Armyworm pressure was reported throughout much of the state. Soybeans blooming and setting pods continued to progress.

#### **Livestock and Pastures**

Cattle and pasture and range were in mostly good to fair condition. Ongoing heat and dry conditions were problematic for cattle producers with some commenting that there may be a need to feed hay before the end of grazing season. Producers reported armyworm pressure in pastures and hay.



#### Accumulated Precipitation (in)



#### Average Temperature (°F)


August 05, 2024 to August 11, 2024
