CATTLE ON FEED

ARIZONA

The number of cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in Arizona feedlots with a capacity of 1,000 head or larger was estimated at 253,000 head as of June 1, 2024. The latest inventory is less than 1 percent below last month's inventory and 1 percent below the June 1, 2023 inventory. Cattle feeders with 1,000 head or larger capacity marketed an estimated 25,000 head of fed cattle during May 2024, up 4 percent from the previous month but down 7 percent from the May 2023 marketings. An estimated 25,000 cattle and calves were placed on feed during May 2024, 9 percent above last month and up 4 percent from May 2023 placements of 24,000 head. Other disappearance for May 2024, at 1,000 head, was no change from last month or last year.

UNITED STATES

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.6 million head on June 1, 2024. The inventory was slightly below June 1, 2023. Placements in feedlots during May totaled 2.05 million head, 4 percent above 2023. Net placements were 1.98 million head. During May, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 395,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 315,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 485,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 531,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 230,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 90,000 head. Marketings of fed cattle during May totaled 1.96 million head, slightly above 2023. Other disappearance totaled 62,000 head during May, 16 percent below 2023.
