CROP PRODUCTION - JUNE 1, 2024

ARIZONA HIGHLIGHTS

Durum wheat production in Arizona, based on conditions as of June 1, 2024, is forecast at 6.02 million bushels, according to the June 1 Agricultural Yield Survey conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. This forecast is down less than 1 percent from the May 1 forecast, but is 58 percent above the 3.81-million-bushel crop produced last year. Area for harvest, forecast at 59,000 acres, is up 22,000 acres, or 59 percent from a year ago. Average yield is forecast at 102.0 bushels per acre, down 1.0 bushel from both the May 1 forecast and from last year's yield.

As of June 2, producers in Arizona had harvested 55 percent of the Durum wheat crop, compared with 46 percent last year and a 5-year average of 32 percent.

UNITED STATES HIGHLIGHTS

Production of **Durum wheat** in Arizona and California is forecast at a collective 7.67 million bushels, down 1 percent from last month but up 33 percent from last year.
