#### March Milk Production in California up 0.7 percent from last March

Milk production during March totaled 3.67 billion pounds, up 0.7 percent from March 2023 and up 8.9 percent February 2024. The number of milk cows on farms in California was 1.71 million head, down 8 thousand from March 2023 and unchanged from February 2024. Production per cow in California averaged 2,145 pounds, up 25 pounds from March 2023 and up 175 pounds from February 2024.


