## CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING MARCH 27, 2016

**AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY:** Snow and rain were received in abundance, reducing field activity and improving moisture conditions. Precipitation in the north eastern district replenished moisture stressed wheat crops. However, areas in the eastern and south eastern districts remained relatively dry, where wheat quality concerns persisted in certain localities. Several cases of stripe rust were reported between the eastern and south eastern districts. As of March 28, mountain snowpack statewide was 97 percent of average. The Southwest and San Luis Valley were 81 and 84 percent of average, respectively. Stored feed supplies were rated 6 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 18 percent surplus. Sheep death loss was 58 percent average and 42 percent light. Cattle death loss was 1 percent heavy, 77 percent average, and 22 percent light.
