CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING APRIL 2, 2017

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: Fieldwork was limited this past week due to considerable moisture received throughout the state, according to the Mountain Region Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Several counties reported significant moisture during the week, improving fall planted crop and pasture conditions. Reporters noted winter wheat in stressed areas has improved with received moisture. Livestock remain in good condition with calving and lambing progressing well so far. As of April 3rd, snowpack in Colorado was at 109 percent measured as percent of median snowfall. The Southwest and San Luis Valley were 128 and 114 percent, respectively. Stored feed supplies were rated 3 percent short, 86 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Sheep death loss was 31 percent average and 69 percent light. Cattle death loss was 1 percent heavy, 74 percent average, and 25 percent light.
