



FLORIDA: The forecast of avocados for certified shipments is 900,000 bushels, unchanged from last month and the initial forecast in August. Although several hurricanes and storms have passed near south Florida, no damaging winds or loss of fruit have been reported. Rainfall has been heavy at times, but not excessive.

Shipments through September are 555,300 bushels, 14 percent more than last season to the same date but less

than the previous season which was the highest since the August 1992 hurricane. Demand is excellent with good prices and returns reported.

CALIFORNIA: Shipments through October 2 total 5,241,000 bushel equivalents, exceeding the estimated total shipments for the season which were 5,018,000 bushel equivalents. Shipments of Haas will continue until the season ends October 31.
