General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Georgia, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, November 17, 2024. Precipitation totals from available reporting stations ranged from no rain to 2.8 inches of rain throughout the week. Average high temperatures ranged from the high 50s to the high 70s. Average low temperatures ranged from the low 40s to the low 60s.

Crops

Many areas of the state received much needed rain last week, with the northern third of the state receiving the most precipitation. Reporters noted that some operators were finally able to begin seeding winter grazing crops after the rain softened up soils. Cloudy and rainy conditions did prevent operators from harvesting cotton and peanuts in some regions. Harvest activities were also a challenge in areas that had received significant precipitation the week prior. In areas that remained mostly dry, short soil moisture levels led to some operators giving up on seeding activities for the year. Some reporters noted that row crop yields in the driest regions of the state were mostly disappointing. Vidalia onion transplant activities began to pick up steam in the southeastern region of the state.

Livestock and Pastures

Cattle were in mostly good to fair condition, while pastures were in mostly fair to poor condition. Low winter hay stocks continued to be a concern for many operators as supplemental feeding activities continued in many areas of the state.



Accumulated Precipitation (in)




Average Temperature (°F)
