2016-2017 HAWAII COFFEE PRODUCTION, YIELD, VALUE INCREASE

The preliminary Hawaii utilized coffee production is estimated at 36.4 million pounds (cherry basis) for the 2016-2017 season, up 5 percent from the previous season. Bearing acreage totaled 6,900 acres, unchanged from the previous year. Average yield is up for the second year in a row, at 5,600 pounds (cherry basis) per acre, up 300 pounds from the previous season. The statewide farm price for coffee averaged \$1.71 per pound (cherry basis), an increase of 10 percent from the previous season's price of \$1.56 per pound. The value of utilized production for coffee is estimated at \$62.2 million (cherry basis) for this season, up 15 percent from last season's \$54.2 million. Survey comments supported the increased yield.
