


# FARM INCOME

## CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$8.76 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2009, 8 percent below 2008. Cash receipts from crops were down 4 percent, and receipts for livestock were 17 percent below the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$6.39 billion, accounted for 73.0 percent of the total cash receipts in 2009 while livestock receipts, at \$2.37 billion, accounted for the remaining 27.0 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 70.0 percent and livestock 30.0 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2009 and amounted to \$3.29 billion. Soybeans were second at \$2.52 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.06 billion. Poultry and Eggs remained as the fourth leading contributor with \$829 million and Dairy follows with \$450 million. These five commodity groups accounted for 93 percent of the 2009 cash receipts.



## LAST SPRING FROST




10% Probability for Frost (32°F) After the Date

## CROP HIGHLIGHTS

**ACREAGE:** Indiana's five major field crops totaled 12.1 million acres for harvest during 2009, down one percent from the 2008 harvested acreage. Corn acreage for harvest was unchanged from a year ago, while soybean acreage for harvest was up slightly from 2009. Winter wheat harvested acreage was down 20 percent from a year ago, but all hay harvested acreage was up 5 percent from the 2008 level. Oat acreage for harvest increased 40 percent from 2008. Other crops showing harvested acreage changes were tomatoes for processing, up 18 percent while tomatoes for fresh market decreased 11 percent. Sweet corn acreage for harvest increased 13 percent and watermelon harvested acreage increased 3 percent from 2008. In addition, snap beans for processing decreased 2 percent, while cucumbers for processing decreased 12 percent from 2008. Furthermore, cantaloupes for fresh market decreased 4 percent.

**YIELDS:** The 2009 growing season got off to a slow start due to cold, wet soil conditions. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of April, many areas of the state encountered snow with some northern areas receiving up to 3 inches. During late April and early May persistent rain showers kept farmers out of the fields, and by May 31<sup>st</sup>, only 78 percent of the intended corn acreage and 50 percent of the soybean acreage had been planted. Some farmers were still trying to plant corn during the second week of June, but many had either switched to soybeans or had taken preventive plantings. It was difficult for farmers to find enough rain-free days in a row to cut and bail hay without it getting wet. Winter wheat harvest progressed at a mostly normal pace across the state with good yields obtained in most areas. Below normal temperatures during July slowed crop development causing concern of potential damage from an early frost. Field crops in some northern counties were under stress from dry conditions in early and mid August while a few central and southern counties experienced flooding. Sudden death syndrome (SDS) and white mold were problems in many soybean fields. Corn and soybeans were very slow to mature, and by mid October, corn harvest was over 20 days behind the average pace. At this same

time, the soybean harvest briefly fell to a new record low pace, but moved out of this territory by the end of the month. Moisture content in harvested corn and soybeans remained higher than desired resulting in a large portion of the crops needing to be dried to prevent spoilage. Corn harvest lagged behind the normal pace all fall and by November 22<sup>nd</sup> it was the latest since 1992. Finally by December 6<sup>th</sup>, 91 percent of the corn acreage had been harvested and the soybean harvest was virtually complete. Mold was a severe problem in harvested corn resulting in considerable price dockage at the elevator with some corn being rejected entirely. The average yield for corn in 2009 was 171 bushels per acre, 11 bushels above the 2008 yield setting a new record high. The average yield for soybeans was 49 bushels per acre, 4 bushels above the 2008 yield. The average yield for winter wheat at 67 bushels per acre was 2 bushels below the previous year's yield of 69 bushels per acre. The average oat yield at 69 bushels per acre was down 6 bushels from last year's yield of 75 bushels per acre. All hay yield at 2.77 tons per acre was down from the 2008 yield of 3.16 tons per acre. Popcorn averaged 4,300 pounds per acre, down 200 pounds from the 4,500 pounds per acre produced a year earlier.

**PRODUCTION:** Corn produced during 2009 totaled 933.7 million bushels, 7 percent above the 2008 level of 873.6 million bushels. Soybean production was 266.6 million bushels, 9 percent above the 244.4 million bushels produced a year earlier. Winter wheat production decreased 22 percent from a year earlier, to 30.2 million bushels. Popcorn production totaled 258.0 million pounds, 6 percent below the 2008 level. Oat production of 483 thousand bushels was 29 percent above the 375 thousand bushels produced in 2008. All hay production, at 1.7 million tons, decreased 8 percent. Peppermint production increased 47 percent while spearmint production increased 6 percent from 2008. Apple production increased 30 percent to 30.0 million pounds. Blueberry production totaled 3.7 million pounds, a 3 percent decrease from the previous year.



Indiana, 1970-2009





## BIOTECHNOLOGY VARIETIES

The National Agricultural Statistics Service conducts the June Agricultural Survey in all States each year. Randomly selected farmers across Indiana are asked if they planted corn or soybean seeds that, through biotechnology, are resistant to herbicides, insects, or both. Conventionally bred herbicide resistant varieties were excluded. Insect resistant varieties include only those containing bacillus thuringiensis (Bt). Stacked gene varieties include those containing biotech traits for both herbicide and insect resistance.

## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

The total value of the four major species of livestock and poultry on Indiana farms January 1, 2010 (December 1, 2009 for swine and chickens) amounted to \$1,130.0 million, down 7 percent from a year earlier.

**HOG AND PIG** numbers (December 1, 2009), at 3.6 million, were up 1 percent from a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from \$91.00 in 2008 to \$84.00 in 2009. This dropped the total inventory value to \$306.6 million, 5 percent below a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2009.

**CATTLE** inventory numbers, at 870,000, were up 1 percent from January 1, 2009 but value per head, at \$870 was \$100 below the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$756.9 million, decreased 9 percent from the \$834.2 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 390,000 head, up 3 percent from a year earlier.

Of this total, 221,000 were beef cows, up 4 percent; and 169,000 were milk cows, up 1 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 52,000 head for January 1, 2010, was up 4 percent, from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 46,000 head. Average value per head at \$187.00, was down \$14.00 from 2009. Total inventory value at \$9.7 million was 3 percent below the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2009, at 31.6 million birds, was up 2 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and remained in third position for hens and pullets of laying age (23.4 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$56.8 million, up 8 percent from 2008. The value per bird increased \$0.10 from the previous year to \$1.80.

# HOGS AND PIGS

The total pig crop in 2009 was down 3 percent from the pig crop in 2008. Sows farrowed during the year was down 6 percent from the previous year, while litter rates increased 3 percent to 9.44. A \$4.30 decrease in average price per hundredweight brought a 9 percent decrease in cash receipts for 2009. Gross income of \$835 million (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) decreased 9 percent from a year earlier.





## CATTLE AND DAIRY PRODUCTS

The total live weight of cattle and calves marketed during 2009 decreased 7 percent from a year earlier. The average price for cattle decreased \$4.70 per cwt. to \$73.80. Calf prices for 2009 averaged \$96.40 per cwt. compared with \$93.00 during 2008. Cash receipts totaled \$224 million, down 11 percent from the \$253 million a year earlier. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) decreased 11 percent from a year earlier.







## SHEEP AND LAMBS

The number of sheep and lambs marketed during 2009 increased 5 percent to 34,500 head. The total pounds of sheep and lambs marketed was slightly below the 2008 level. Cash receipts totaled \$2.58 million, up 24 percent from \$2.07 million in 2008. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) totaled \$3.24 million in 2009 compared with \$2.78 million a year earlier. Sheep averaged \$29.00 per cwt. and lambs averaged \$105.00 per cwt. during 2009.

Lambs saved in 2009, at 44,000 head, was up 7 percent from the previous year. The number of ewes one year old and older on hand January 1, 2010 was up 6 percent from 2009. Lamb Crop per 100 ewes one year old and older was 129 during 2009, up 10 percent from a year earlier.

Wool production was down 4 percent from the previous year, at 240,000 pounds. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 40,000 head with an average fleece weight of 6.0 pounds. Total value of shorn wool was \$55,000, up 22 percent from a year earlier and averaged 23 cents per pound.



## COMMERCIAL SHEEP SLAUGHTER NUMBER OF HEAD, INDIANA, 2004-2009



# POULTRY AND OTHER LIVESTOCK

Total value of production from eggs was \$353.0 million in 2009, down 34 percent from a year earlier. The average number of layers at 23.6 million was 2 percent below 2008. The average rate of lay was up 1 percent from 2007, at 273 eggs per layer, resulting in a 1 percent decrease in total egg production during 2009. The average price received by producers for eggs was 65.6 cents per dozen compared with 98.5 cents a year earlier.





## COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

The County Highlights section summarizes the importance of agriculture to each and every Indiana county while comparing the magnitude of importance across counties.

Planted acreage for hay is represented by three dashes because this category is not estimated, planted acreage and yield for popcorn are represented by three dashes because these categories are not surveyed; in all other places the three dashes represent zero for that county. An asterisk signifies that the county has data for this item, but it cannot be disclosed for confidentiality purposes. The 2007 Chicken data from Census includes only layers twenty weeks old and older.
