

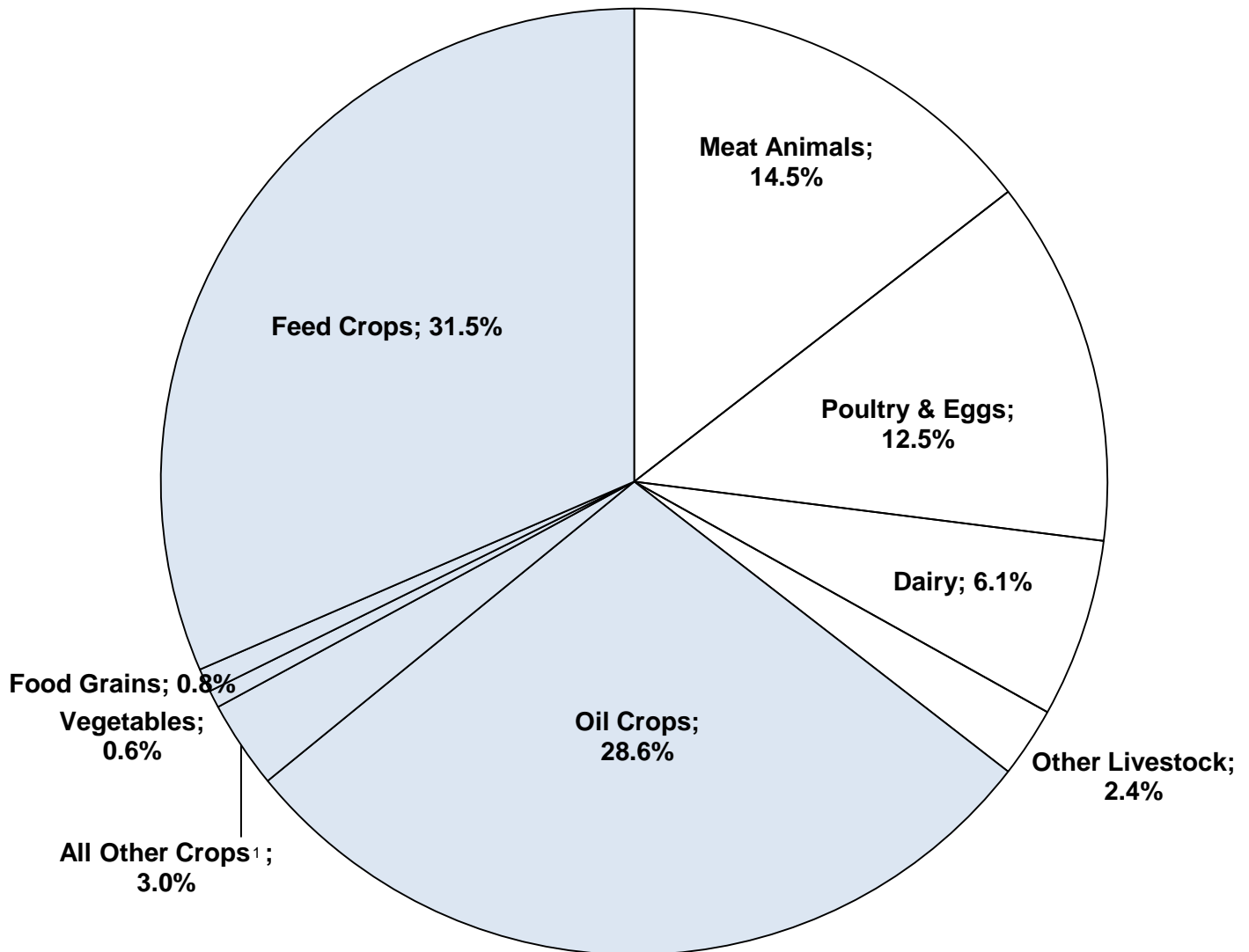
# FARM INCOME

## CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$10.7 billion in cash receipts from farm marketing's in 2018, up fractionally from 2017. Cash receipts from crops were up 1 percent, and receipts for livestock were 1 percent below the previous year. Marketing's of crops at \$6.91 billion, accounted for 64.6 percent of the total cash receipts in 2018 while livestock receipts, at \$3.80 billion, accounted for the remaining 35.4 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 64.2 percent and livestock 35.8 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2018 and amounted to \$3.32 billion. Soybeans were second at \$3.06 billion and meat animals remained in third place with \$1.55 billion. Poultry and eggs was the fourth leading contributor with \$1.34 billion and Dairy follows with \$649 million. These five commodity groups accounted for almost 93 percent of the 2018 cash receipts.
