KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. May 4, 2020 - For the week ending May 3, 2020, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 9 percent very short, 30 short, 56 adequate, and 5 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7 percent very short, 21 short, 68 adequate, and 4 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 6 percent very poor, 16 poor, 36 fair, 37 good, and 5 excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 79 percent, near 75 last year, but behind 84 for the five-year average. Headed was 17 percent, ahead of 11 last year, but behind 34 average.

Corn planted was 42 percent, near 38 last year and 45 average. Emerged was 13 percent, near 12 last year, but behind 19 average.

Soybeans planted was 11 percent, ahead of 4 both last year and average. Emerged was 1 percent.

Sorghum planted was 2 percent, near 1 both last year and average.

Cotton planted was 4 percent, near 3 last year and 1 average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 2 percent very poor, 9 poor, 33 fair, 49 good, and 7 excellent.
