KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 29, 2021 - For the week ending March 28, 2021, there were 2.2 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 8% short, 72% adequate, and 16% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 14% short, 71% adequate, and 9% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 15% poor, 31% fair, 43% good, and 7% excellent.
