KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. December 13, 2021 - For the week ending December 12, 2021, there were 6.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 24% very short, 39% short, 37% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 23% very short, 34% short, 43% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 35% fair, 43% good, and 8% excellent.

Cotton harvested was 95%, well ahead of 74% last year.

This is the last weekly Crop Progress and Condition report for the 2021 growing season. We would like to extend our appreciation to the dedicated county FSA and extension staff who supplied the necessary information for these reports. For December through February, we will issue monthly reports. The first monthly report (for week ending January 2) will be issued January 3, 2022. Weekly reports will begin February 28th for the 2022 season.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
