KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. December 2, 2024 - For the week ending December 1, 2024, there were 5.4 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 5% very short, 16% short, 74% adequate, and 5% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7% very short, 26% short, 65% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 9% poor, 31% fair, 47% good, and 9% excellent.

Cotton harvested was 79%, behind 89% last year, and equal to the five-year average.

Sunflowers harvested was 95%, near 96% last year and 97% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 10% very poor, 21% poor, 46% fair, 22% good, and 1% excellent.
