KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. December 9, 2024 - For the week ending December 8, 2024, there were 6.3 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 18% short, 74% adequate, and 4% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7% very short, 27% short, 64% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 7% poor, 35% fair, 47% good, and 8% excellent.

Cotton harvested was 87%, behind 94% last year, and equal to the five-year average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 10% very poor, 20% poor, 45% fair, 24% good, and 1% excellent.
