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KANSAS 2024 FARM REAL ESTATE VALUE AND CASH RENT

MANHATTAN, Kan. August 2, 2024 - Kansas's farm real estate value, a measurement of the value of all land and buildings on farms, increased from 2023, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Farm real estate value for 2024 averaged \$2,970 per acre, up \$220 per acre (up 8%) from last year.

Cropland value increased 7% from last year to \$3,300 per acre. **Dryland cropland value** averaged \$3,200 per acre, \$220 higher than last year. **Irrigated cropland value** averaged \$4,460 per acre, \$240 above a year ago. **Pastureland**, at \$2,100 per acre, was \$170 higher than the previous year.

Cash rents paid to landlords in 2024 for cropland increased from last year. Irrigated cropland rent averaged \$164.00 per acre, \$10.00 above last year. Dryland cropland rent averaged \$65.00 per acre, \$2.50 higher than a year earlier. Pasture rented for cash averaged \$22.50 per acre, \$0.50 above the previous year.
