## Minnesota Ag News – Farm Production Expenditures





Minnesota farm production expenditures totaled \$25.0 billion in 2023, according to the USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service - Farm Production 2023 Summary report. Expenditures This \$3.18 billion higher than the 2022 total expenditures. Feed expense, up 25 percent to \$4.48 billion, represented the largest single production expense in Minnesota in 2023, accounting for 18 percent of the total. Rent, up 13 percent to \$2.71 billion, was the second largest expense and accounted for 11 percent of total expenditures. Farm Services and Fertilizer, Lime, and Soil Conditioners accounted for 9 percent of the total each. Farm Services was up 15 percent to \$2.24 billion.



Fertilizer, Lime and Soil Conditioners were down 6 percent to \$2.30 billion. The largest percentage increases from last year were for Interest (up 57 percent), Other Farm Machinery (up 44 percent), and Livestock, Poultry and Related (up 30 percent). The largest percentage decreases from last year were for Trucks and Autos (down 24 percent), Fertilizer, Lime and Soil Conditioner (down 6 percent), and Fuels (down 6 percent).
