According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 4.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, June 7, 2015**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 4 percent short, 65 percent adequate, and 31 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 4 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 22 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 57.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Fulton to 71.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Collins. Highs ranged from 78.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Ashland and Independence to 91.4 degrees Fahrenheit at Collins. Most of the state received some rain with the highest averaging 1.29 inches in the coastal part of the state.
