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## Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition Report

Week Ending April 17, 2016

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 1.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 17, 2016. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 3 percent short, 35 percent adequate, and 62 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 2 percent short, 47 percent adequate, and 51 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 45.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Aberdeen to 62.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 65.7 degrees Fahrenheit at Tupelo and Winona to 78.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Columbia. Most of the state received some rain with the southeast part of the state receiving the most at an average of 5.54 inches.
