According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 5.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 20, 2016**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 61 percent very short, 26 percent short, 12 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 52 percent very short, 30 percent short, 17 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 35.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Belzoni to 51.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 69.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Ashland to 78.9 degrees Fahrenheit at Yazoo City. Most of the state received some rain with the north central part of the state receiving the most at an average of 0.75 inches.
