**Released: November 12, 2019**

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 3.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 10, 2019**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 6 percent short, 72 percent adequate, and 22 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 12 percent short, 69 percent adequate, and 18 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 31.2 degrees Fahrenheit at Winona to 49.9 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 59.9 degrees Fahrenheit at Independence to 75.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Macon. Minimal precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration in the northeast part of the State with an average of 0.50 inch.
