Message from the Editor

This is the **final Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition Report** for 2024. We will resume this report in March 2025. We would like to give special thanks to our County Agents and Mississippi State University Extension Service for their ongoing participation.

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 24, 2024**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 4 percent very short, 28 percent short, 61 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 4 percent very short, 35 percent short, 54 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus.

Mississippi Subsoil Moisture Map for the week of November 11 – November 17, 2024

The Soil Moisture Active Passive (SMAP) provides measurements of soil moisture in the root zone as a weekly average, represented by pixels. Each pixel represents 9 by 9 kilometer plot or about 20,000 acres. The SMAP data measures soil moisture in cubic centimeters of water/cubic centimeters of soil.
