

Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2024 was 3.35 million head, up 3 percent from March 1, 2024 and up 3 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 415,000 head, was down 10,000 from the previous quarter and down 40,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.94 million head, was up 4 percent from last quarter and up 5 percent from last year.

The March-May 2024 pig crop, at 2.46 million head, was down 1 percent from 2023. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 220,000 head, down 5,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.20 for the March-May period, compared with 11.10 last year.


