



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released September 26, 2024

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2024 was 3.45 million head, up 1 percent from June 1, 2024 but unchanged from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 420,000 head, was up 5,000 from the previous quarter but unchanged from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 3.03 million head, was up 2 percent from last quarter but unchanged from last year.

The June-August 2024 pig crop, at 2.46 million head, was down 10 percent from 2023. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 220,000 head, down 5,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.20 for the June-August period, compared with 12.20 last year.

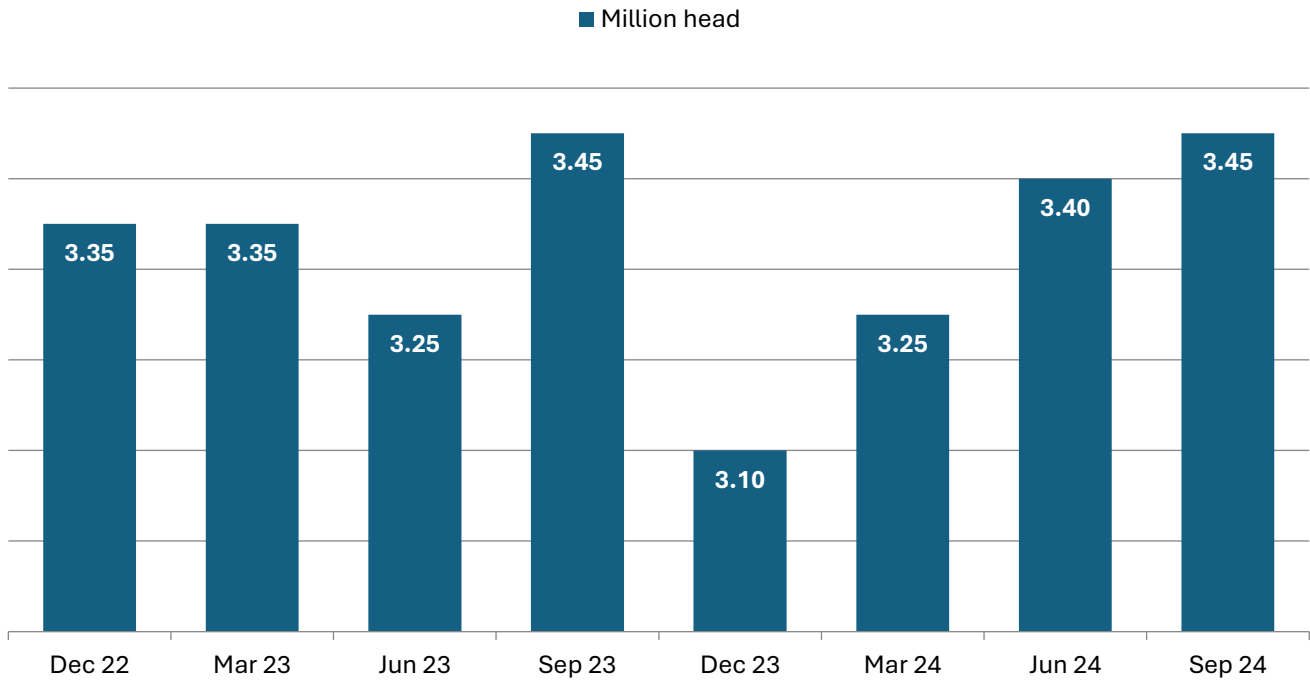
