#### December Milk Production in California up 0.3 percent

Milk production during December totaled 3.5 billion pounds, up 0.3 percent from December 2021 and up 5.2 percent November 2022. The number of milk cows on farms in California was 1.724 million head, up 5,000 from December 2021 and unchanged from November 2022. Production per cow in California averaged 2,030 pounds, unchanged pounds from December 2021 and up 100 pounds from November 2022.


