January Milk Production in California down slightly

Milk production during January totaled 3.534 billion pounds, down slightly from January 2022 and up 1.5 percent December 2022. The number of milk cows on farms in California was 1.724 million head, up 4,000 from January 2022 and unchanged from December 2022. Production per cow in California averaged 2,050 pounds, down 5 pounds from January 2022 and up 30 pounds from December 2022.


