Excellent Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 7 days suitable for field work. The heat is hitting over 90 degrees in many areas with little sustained rain. Droughty, sandy soils require more recharge. Most fruit and vegetable growers will need some form of irrigation. The majority of all corn is reported at good to excellent condition, while the majority of hay alfalfa, and other hay are reported at fair to good condition. Corn is drying down quickly. Hay work conditions are good in general. Grasshoppers are prevalent in some areas.
