Excellent Week for Field Work: New Jersey had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. High temperatures reaching the high 70's and low temperatures in the low 40's to 50's. Hay Alfalfa third cutting is almost done and Hay other than Alfalfa is progressing. Soybean coloring is almost done. Soybean dropping leaves is progressing. Fall vegetable harvest is well underway with sweet potatoes, winter squashes, all greens including lettuces, spinach, cole crops, beets/chard, and leeks being harvested daily, weather permitting.
