Overview

The USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) conducts hundreds of surveys every year and prepares reports covering virtually every aspect of U.S. agriculture. Production and supplies of food and fiber, prices paid and received by farmers, farm labor and wages, farm finances, chemical use, and changes in the demographics of U.S. producers are only a few examples.

NASS is committed to providing timely, accurate, and useful statistics in service to U.S. agriculture.

To uphold our continuing commitment, NASS will:

- Report the facts on American agriculture, facts needed by people working in and depending upon U.S. agriculture.
- Provide objective and unbiased statistics on a preannounced schedule that is fair and impartial to all market participants.
- Conduct the Census of Agriculture every five years, providing the only source of consistent, comparable, and detailed agricultural data for every county in America.
- Serve the needs of our data users and customers at a local level through our network of State field offices and our cooperative relationship with universities and State Departments of Agriculture.
- Safeguard the privacy of farmers, ranchers, and other data providers, with a guarantee that confidentiality and data security continue to be our top priorities.





STATISTICAL REPORTS PROGRAM

The USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service compiles current and historic statistics concerning agriculture in North Carolina. Information most often requested by farmers, the general public, and workers in government agencies are included. Reporting of crop and livestock statistics is a service provided to farmers and others in the State by NASS in cooperation with the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The collection and dissemination of agricultural statistics started in 1863. This is one of the oldest activities of the United States Department of Agriculture. It was recognized that there were advantages of a joint relationship between the State and Federal Governments in the development of agricultural statistics. In 1919, the N.C. Department of Agriculture entered into a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide detailed agricultural statistics. The agreement resulted in the creation of the Agricultural Statistics Division of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

NASS publishes official statistics on North Carolina crops, livestock, prices, and various other agricultural items. The most requested reports and the approximate dates of releases are shown in the table below. These reports and more are free and available online at www.nass.usda.gov/Publications or by writing to: State Statistician, Agricultural Statistics, PO Box 27767, Raleigh, NC 27611.

This year, NASS will also collect information for the Census of Agriculture, a complete count of U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them. Conducted every five years, the Census of Agriculture provides the only source of uniform, comprehensive, and impartial agriculture data for every county in the nation. Census questionnaires will be sent to every known producer in the country in November 2022. Deadline for response is February 2023, and the data will be released spring/summer 2024.



NUMBER OF FARMS AND LAND IN FARMS







DEFINITIONS & METHODOLOGY

Cash receipts for agricultural commodities are defined as the gross income from sales of crops, livestock, and livestock products during a calendar year. The USDA, Economic Research Service (ERS) uses USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) estimates to develop state level cash receipts. The county level cash receipts in this publication are based on the ERS state level cash receipts and various NASS county data. To ensure respondent confidentiality, estimates at any level, including county estimates, are not published if those estimates would disclose any information about individual operations. 

SOURCE OF FARM CASH RECEIPTS, NORTH CAROLINA, 2021






CROPS CASH RECEIPTS LEADING COUNTIES






MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR CORN (Dollars per Bushel)






UNITED STATES COMMERCIAL HOG SLAUGHTER


















TOP APPLE COUNTIES

(Bearing and Non-Bearing Acres)




TOP BLUEBERRY COUNTIES





TOP PEACH COUNTIES (Bearing and Non-Bearing Acres)








TOP HEAD CABBAGE COUNTIES

(Harvested Acres - Fresh Market and Processing)




TOP SWEET CORN COUNTIES


