NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 4, 2024 - For the week ending November 3, 2024, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 20% very short, 38% short, 40% adequate, and 2% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 20% very short, 36% short, 42% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 23% poor, 25% fair, 42% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 92%, near 93% for both last year and the five-year average.

Corn harvested was 85%, well ahead of 64% both last year and average.

Sunflowers harvested was 62%, ahead of 45% last year and 55% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 20% very poor, 25% poor, 28% fair, 26% good, and 1% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 18% very short, 25% short, 55% adequate, and 2% surplus.
