#### General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in South Carolina, there were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, October 27, 2024. Precipitation totals from available reporting stations ranged from no rain to over an inch of rain. Average high temperatures ranged from the high 70s to the mid 80s. Average low temperatures ranged from the low 40s to the low 60s.

#### Crops

It was another dry week for the state, with only the Upstate, Midland, and Pee Dee regions of the state receiving even minimal amounts of precipitation. Reporters noted that some parts of the state had not received any rain in over four weeks. The dry weather was ideal for harvest activities, with cotton, peanut, and soybean harvest all ahead of historical progress. Yields of field crops were reported to be mostly better than expected after a dry season, although flooded fields from Hurricane Helene caused significant crop loss in some regions. Seeding of small grains and cover crops were underway, although many producers were holding off due to dry soil conditions.

#### **Livestock and Pastures**

Cattle were in mostly good to fair condition, while pastures were in mostly fair to poor condition. Pastures were in desperate need of rain in some parts of the state. Some livestock producers were already feeding winter hay due to the lack of soil moisture stalling pasture growth in many areas.




