Texas Goat Inventory: The January 1, 2023 all goat inventory in Texas totaled 806 thousand head, 3 percent below last year. Meat and other goats accounted for 90 percent of all goat inventory with 725 thousand head. The Angora goat inventory decreased 3 percent to 59 thousand head. The inventory of milk goats on January 1, 2023 totaled 22 thousand head, 8 percent below last year.

Texas Angora Goats and Mohair: The Angora goat inventory as of January 1, 2023 was 2 thousand head lower than the previous year. During 2022, 55 thousand goats and kids were clipped, 6 thousand head lower than the year before. Mohair production decreased 20 thousand pounds to 315 thousand pounds. The average clip weight for 2022 was 5.7 pounds. The price per pound of mohair increased 130 cents in 2022 to \$9.00. This brought the total value of the state's mohair production to 2.84 million dollars for 2022, 255 thousand dollars higher than 2021.

U.S. Highlights: All goat inventory in the United States on January 1, 2023 totaled 2.51 million head. Breeding goat inventory totaled 2.06 million head and market goats totaled 451 thousand head. On January 1, 2023, milk goats totaled 400 thousand head, Angora goats totaled 107 thousand head and meat and other goats totaled 2.00 million head. The 2022 kid crop was 1.58 million head for all goats.

Mohair production during 2022 totaled 520 thousand pounds. Goats and kids clipped, at 99.0 thousand head, were down 6 percent from 2021. Average weight per clip at 5.3 pounds, was up 2 percent from 2021. Value of mohair production was 3.30 million, 8 percent above 2021.

A random sample of U.S. producers was surveyed to provide data for these estimates. Survey procedures ensured that all sheep and goat producers, regardless of size, had a chance to be included in the survey. Large producers were sampled more heavily than small operations. About 23,000 operators were contacted during the first half of January by mail, telephone and face-to-face personal interview and 61 percent of the reports were usable. Regardless of when operators responded, they were asked to report inventories as of January 1.
