

This report contains results from the December 2024 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of December. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on January 24, 2025.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Texas feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.88 million head on December 1, 2024, down 1 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 345 thousand head in commercial feedlots during November, down 12 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 330 thousand head during November, down 10 percent from 2023.

On December 1, there were 2.57 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was unchanged from last year and from the November 1 total. November placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 309 thousand head, down 28 percent from the October total. Marketings were down 19 percent from last month at 297 thousand head.







Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Oklahoma feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 365 thousand head on December 1, 2024, up 12 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 44 thousand head in commercial feedlots during November, down 10 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 42 thousand head during November, up 11 percent from 2023. Other disappearance during November totaled 2 thousand head, up 1,000 head from a year ago.
