## CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 13, 2024

**AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY**: Warm temperatures helped corn for grain harvest progress considerably this week, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Topsoil moisture conditions rated adequate to surplus decreased from 56 percent last week to 40 percent as of October 13. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor for October 10, drought conditions were present across more than 13 percent of the State, up 3 percentage points from last week. Abnormally dry conditions sat at 76 percent of the State, up 4 percentage points from the previous week. Beaver County reports farmers were busy harvesting corn for grain, and the fourth cutting of alfalfa. Box Elder County reports noted producers were busy harvesting corn for grain, hauling onions to storage, finishing apple harvest, and working on field preparation for fall winter wheat seeding. In Duchesne County, a wildfire was burning west of the county, where many sheep graze from late summer until now. Statewide, the fourth cutting of alfalfa hay was 57 percent complete. Statewide, winter wheat seeded for harvest next year was at 75 percent complete, with crop emergence at 37 percent complete. Corn dented and corn mature were at 95 percent complete and 88 percent complete, respectively. Statewide, corn silage harvest was 74 percent complete. Corn being harvested for grain was 23 percent complete by the end of the week. Statewide, producers continued moving cattle and sheep from summer pastures, with an estimated 50 percent of cattle and calves and 53 percent of sheep and lambs off of summer grazing by week's end. Cattle and sheep receiving supplement feed started early, at 24 percent complete and 40 percent, respectively.

Stock water supplies were reported as 2 percent very short, 7 percent short, 73 percent adequate, and 18 percent surplus, compared with 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 20 percent surplus last week. Irrigation water supplies were reported as 33 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 12 percent excellent, compared with 1 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 19 percent excellent last week.
