USDA TO CONDUCT CONSERVATION PRACTICE ADOPTION MOTIVATIONS SURVEY

LAKEWOOD, Colo. – June 6, 2024 – USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will collect responses to the Conservation Practice Adoption Motivations Survey over the coming weeks. Survey recipients may respond securely online at www.agcounts.usda.gov, by phone, or mail. A representative for NASS may call producers to set up an interview to assist in the completion of the questionnaire.

In late June, NASS will mail the survey to 5,000 farmers and ranchers in the Mountain Region States of Arizona, Colorado, Montana, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming. A joint project between NASS and USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), this new survey is aimed at better understanding conservation practice adoption and the role of technical and financial assistance. The data will be used to guide the implementation of NRCS programs in the future.

"Gathering information about the motivation for and adoption of conservation practices by farmers and ranchers allows USDA to understand the use and awareness of its programs," said Rodger Ott, Director, Mountain Regional Field Office. "By continuing to collect survey responses, NASS can ensure we have the most accurate and representative data."

There are two versions of the survey this year – one requesting information on grazing conservation practices and one for forestry conservation practices. Data from both versions of the survey will be released October 28, 2024. All NASS reports are available online at www.nass.usda.gov/Publications/.
