GRAIN STOCKS – JUNE 1, 2024

ARIZONA

Off-farm **corn** stocks in Arizona on June 1, 2024, were 2.827 million bushels, up 43 percent from June 1, 2023, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Off-farm **barley** stocks totaled 39,000 bushels on June 1, 2024. Other Arizona grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

COLORADO

Colorado **corn** stocks in all positions on June 1, 2024, were 32.55 million bushels, up 29 percent from June 1, 2023, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Corn stored on farms amounted to 20.00 million bushels, up 33 percent from a year ago. Corn stored off farms amounted to 12.55 million bushels, up 22 percent from a year ago. Off-farm **sorghum** stocks totaled 687,000 bushels on June 1, 2024, down 8 percent from last year. Off-farm **oat** stocks totaled 11,000 bushels, down 65 percent from a year ago.

Off-farm **barley** stocks totaled 4.66 million bushels on June 1, 2024, up 95 percent from last year. **All wheat** stocks in all positions were 22.29 million bushels, up 75 percent from June 1, 2023. All wheat stored on farms amounted to 1.80 million bushels, up 20 percent from a year ago. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 20.49 million bushels, up 82 percent from a year ago. Other Colorado grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

MONTANA

Oat stocks in all positions in Montana on June 1, 2024, were 320,000 bushels, up 103 percent from June 1, 2023, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Oats stored off-farm were up 150 percent from last year to 20,000 bushels. Oats stored on farm amounted to 300,000 bushels, up 100 percent from a year ago. Montana **barley** stocks in all positions on June 1, 2024, were 18.21 million bushels, up 75 percent from a year ago. Barley stored on farms was 9.70 million bushels, up 155 percent from last year. Off-farm barley storage was up 28 percent from a year ago to 8.51 million bushels.

All wheat stocks in all positions in Montana on June 1, 2024, were 51.32 million bushels, up 27 percent from June 1, 2023. All wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 29.50 million bushels, up 23 percent from a year ago. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 21.82 million bushels, up 32 percent from a year ago. **Durum wheat** stocks in all positions were 6.32 million bushels, down 21 percent from a year ago. Durum wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 4.90 million bushels, and Durum wheat stored off farms amounted to 1.42 million bushels. Other Montana grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

NEW MEXICO

New Mexico grain stocks on June 1, 2024, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UTAH

Off-farm **barley** stocks in Utah on June 1, 2024, were 26.00 million bushels, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. This is down 68 percent from June 1, 2023. Off-farm **all wheat** stocks totaled 3.72 million bushels, up 36 percent from last year. Other Utah grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

WYOMING

Wyoming grain stocks on June 1, 2024, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UNITED STATES

Corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 4.99 billion bushels, up 22 percent from June 1, 2023. Of the total stocks, 3.03 billion bushels are stored on farms, up 37 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 1.97 billion bushels, are up 4 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2024 indicated disappearance is 3.36 billion bushels, compared with 3.29 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Grain sorghum stored in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 49.8 million bushels, down 6 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 5.23 million bushels, are down 18 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 44.5 million bushels, are down 4 percent from June 1, 2023. The March - May 2024 indicated disappearance from all positions is 56.0 million bushels, up less than 1 percent from the same period last year.

Old crop oats stored in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 36.3 million bushels, 4 percent above the stocks on June 1, 2023. Of the total stocks on hand, 11.7 million bushels are stored on farms, 15 percent below a year ago. Off-farm stocks totaled 24.6 million bushels, 17 percent above the previous year. Indicated disappearance during March - May 2024 totaled 15.2 million bushels, 87 percent above the same period a year ago.

Old crop barley stocks in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 77.9 million bushels, up 18 percent from June 1, 2023. On-farm stocks are estimated at 28.9 million bushels, 51 percent above a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 49.1 million bushels, are 5 percent above June 1, 2023. The March - May 2024 indicated disappearance is 33.7 million bushels, 47 percent above the same period a year earlier.

Old crop all wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 702 million bushels, up 23 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 139 million bushels, up 12 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 563 million bushels, are up 27 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2024 indicated disappearance is 387 million bushels, up 4 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Old crop Durum wheat stocks in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 21.1 million bushels, down 24 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 9.99 million bushels, are down 22 percent from June 1, 2023. Off-farm stocks totaled 11.1 million bushels, down 26 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2024 indicated disappearance of 15.3 million bushels is up 90 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2024 totaled 970 million bushels, up 22 percent from June 1, 2023. On-farm stocks totaled 466 million bushels, up 44 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 504 million bushels, are up 6 percent from a year ago. Indicated disappearance for the March - May 2024 quarter totaled 875 million bushels, down 2 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Pulse crops stored in all positions on June 1, 2024 and the change from June 1, 2023 are: dry edible peas, 2.59 million cwt, down 39 percent; lentils, 844 thousand cwt, down 28 percent; all chickpeas, 1.37 million cwt, down 9 percent; small chickpeas, 494 thousand cwt, up 11 percent; and large chickpeas, 879 thousand cwt, down 18 percent. Small chickpeas are defined as peas that will pass through a 20/64 inch round hole screen. Large chickpeas are defined as larger than 20/64 inches.
